

FIP Commissions Delegate Guidelines

The Commissions are the technical organs of FIP. They work under these General Guidelines and the guidance of the FIP Board following a long-term programme established by FIP.

Main duties of the Commissions defined by FIP are:

- a) To develop and promote interest in their special fields.
- b) To establish rules and procedures in their special fields.
- c) To prepare brochures to explain their special fields.

- The member appointed as a delegate on the FIP Commission must be the Life Member of Philatelic Congress of India (PCI) and holding the membership for at least two years.
- The member can become a delegate of only one FIP Commissions at the same time.
- The appointed delegate should attend the meeting of the FIP Commissions at least once in two years.
- It is the duty of the appointed delegate to communicate all the communications received from the respective Commission to the Secretary General of PCI from time to time.
- It is the duty of the appointed delegate to take active participation in the activities of the respective Commission.
- It is the duty of the appointed delegate to promote the interest in their special fields, inform the PCI members about the guidelines, rules and regulations or respective changes if any.
- It is the duty of the appointed delegate to send the detailed report of the respective Commission to PCI GC once in a year. In case of noncompliance necessary action may be taken by the PCI GC on the respective appointed delegate.
- PCI can anytime withdraw the name of the appointed delegate of the respective Commission and appoint a new delegate.
- After every three years a new delegate will be appointed for respective Commissions to give an opportunity to other interested members. In case if no other member is interested in the appointment, then the current delegate may continue.
